Congratulations all! The bill passed the House last night and after discussion, they were unable to attach the amendment that requires drug testing to receive federal benefits! It was a real team effort but special thanks go to Penny Young and especially Jason Dunn. Great job all!

SERVICE PROGRAMS AT RISK

H.R. 1 (the new budget bill) would eliminate **all national service programs such as AmeriCorps, VISTA, Youthbuild and Senior Corps. People who disagree with this decision need to go into action.** We need to let our elected officials know this is really not what most voters want. We understand the deficit is important, but there are many ways to close it. The Senate will be deciding next week how to respond to the House bill. Senators need to get the message that their constituents will support those officials who stand up for critical programs benefitting low income people and protecting the planet. **ACTION STEPS YOU CAN TAKE:**

- CALL THE LOCAL OFFICES OF BOTH YOUR SENATORS.** (Go to www.congress.org and enter your zip code to find out their contact information.) **Your Senators need to hear from you immediately.** Please tell them not to support HR 1 which eliminates national service programs like AmeriCorps and Youthbuild.

To schedule an appointment, visit one of the CAP locations and bring 1) your brown LG&E bill or past due bill with a disconnection notice, or an eviction notice from your landlord if utilities are included in your rent and 2) a photo ID. All applicants must be Jefferson County residents with a household income within 130% of the federal poverty guidelines.
