Online Ticket Buying:

1. Visit www.2011seniorpga.com
2. Click **Non-Profit Group Sale** on the right-side of the Home Page
3. Under Promotional Code or Access Key required choose **Non-Profit** as the access code
4. You will then choose your ticket option with quantity and click **Add to Cart**
5. You can choose to continue shopping and add more ticket packages. When you are finished with your selection, you will choose **Check Out**
6. At Customer Check out: Step 1 of 3 click on the drop down arrow at **Affiliation Name** and choose **The Coalition for the Homeless, Inc.** This is a required field and must be selected in order to move on to the next step of purchasing.

PHOTO IDENTIFICATION FOR HOMELESS INDIVIDUALS

Beginning June, homeless persons will be able to get one-year \$4 photo IDs. At that point, The Coalition will no longer pay for a portion of those IDs. Starting today and until then, if you have a client that needs the \$12 allocation for an ID, you will need to have a staff person come to The Coalition with the appropriate information in order to get the \$12 check for the circuit court clerk's office. They are no longer allowing us to pay for these IDs after the fact.

Don't forget that you must meet all the requirements of membership (including paying dues) to be eligible for discount TARC tickets. Agencies that have not paid their dues will be ineligible for April TARC tickets! HERE ARE TWO RESOURCES TO HELP LOW-INCOME FAMILIES SAVE THEIR HOMES

First, the Jefferson County Clerk's Office has a new on-line service which allows anyone to go on-line and check to see if any taxes are owed on your property for the past 11 years. This service is important because your unpaid taxes can be sold to a third party who can add additional fees and foreclose on your home for non-payment. You can also use this to help clients by going to www.jeffersoncountyclerk.org and checking by parcel number, address or taxpayer name.

Additionally, Kentucky Housing Corporation has just released The Kentucky Unemployment Bridge Program (UBP) is a new **loan** option for eligible homeowners to assist them in making their mortgage payments. To be eligible, the homeowner must have experienced a job loss or reduction in income due to changing economic conditions, through no fault of their own, and demonstrates a need for assistance. The job-related event must have occurred since January 1, 2009. The maximum amount of assistance is \$20,000 or 12 months, whichever occurs first. Of the \$20,000, the maximum amount that may be used for reinstatement—all related fees and payments to bring your loan(s) current—is \$7,500. To find out more, go to www.kyhousing.org.

I BELIEVE IN HUD

HUD is taking the "I Believe in HUD" campaign outside the agency by asking external stakeholders and partners to submit 60 second videos to HUD's YouTube Channel or to offer their thoughts on The HUDdle sharing why they support our work. In a YouTube video announcing this effort, the Deputy Secretary asks stakeholders to describe the organization they work for and its relation to HUD, the pressing needs they are meeting, and why they believe in HUD. The request has been blasted out to thousands of our partners and we've already gotten a few responses. But we'd love your help spreading the word and letting us hear from more people.

A FREE MEDICAL CLINIC will be held April 30, 2011 at the 930 Art Center on Mary Street. There will be doctors, dentists, nurses, a pharmacy, massage therapists, chiropractors, vision testing, food and clothes pantry, a free meal and more. FREE GED TESTING: The GED test will be free in Kentucky through June 30. Kentuckians taking the test during that timeframe will not have to pay the usual \$55 fee.
