

LOUISVILLE METRO CONTINUUM OF CARE 2014 HOMELESS CENSUS

NUMBER OF HOMELESS PEOPLE

The homeless service providers in Jefferson County, Kentucky, counted 7,697 unduplicated homeless people who were served between January 1, 2014, and December 31, 2014. This represents a 10.6% decrease in the number of homeless people last year over the year prior, including people who were sheltered (who stayed in emergency or transitional shelter) and unsheltered (who lived only on the streets or in camps). As with each year, the count of the unsheltered homeless is likely an undercount due to the difficulty in counting this population.

^{*} The method for calculating the unsheltered homeless changed this year, so we will be able to better evaluate the trend in 2015.

HOMELESS SUBPOPULATION COUNTS

The below numbers apply to all 7,697 homeless people counted in Jefferson County last year. Please note that these subpopulations are not mutually exclusive—e.g., someone could have a disability and be a veteran.

^{**} The chronic homeless total is an estimate. Chronic data is skewed because new questions were introduced by HUD mid-year. However, these new questions should provide a better picture of chronic homelessness in the future.

SHELTER CAPACITY

The shelter capacity is the total number of shelter beds that were available during the reporting period. ES means "emergency shelter," and TS means "transitional shelter."
