Homeless Prevention Pilot Project (HPPP)

- The project began in June 2005, as legislated by HB 376, KY Act 194A.735.
- HPPP was designed to offer institutional discharge planning on a voluntary basis to persons exiting state operated prisons, mental health facilities, and foster care.
- The Cabinet for Health and Family Services/Department for Behavioral Health, Developmental and Intellectual Disabilities developed project guidelines and offers oversight.
- The project provides case management to participants entering the Adanta Region and Jefferson Co.

HPPP Objectives

OBJECTIVE 1:

Offer discharge planning services in one rural area and one urban area of the state.

OBJECTIVE 2:

Provide access to housing and community services through a single service agency in each area.

OBJECTIVE 3:


To prevent 88% of the participants served from becoming homeless.
