Trainers

J'Lissabeth Faughn is a transgender and social justice speaker to schools and companies around the country. She has worked at institutions including University of California Berkeley, University of Missouri, University of Alabama Birmingham and Sacramento State University. She served as the first male-to-female transsexual Women's Resource Center director and first open transgender Multi-Cultural Center director at Sacramento State.

Chris Hartman is the director of Louisville's Fairness Campaign and is a steering committee member of Kentucky's Fairness Coalition. He served as Congressman John Yarmuth's 2008 campaign press secretary, an AmeriCorps VISTA, and as Philadelphia director of the DNC's grassroots fundraising effort in the 2004 presidential election.

Martha Lawfer is the Human Relations Supervisor overseeing the Investigative Unit of the Louisville Metro Human Relations Commission. She began as Employment and Public Accommodations Investigator nine years ago and has served in the supervisor role for almost three years overseeing discrimination complaints and investigations.

These trainings are designed for HUD-funded homeless shelters and housing providers by Metro Louisville and the Coalition for the Homeless.
